Fire Permit forms are available at Town Hall. Section 14.01 of By-law S-11, A By-law Respecting the Fire Department, states, "Any person who proposes to

ignite a fire within the Town limits shall make a written application to the Fire Chief for a permit." A new permit is required each time you burn. (This does not include backyard fire pits). Fines for not having a valid permit range from \$50 to \$200. To find out if there is a fire ban in your area contact the Town Office at 575-2241 or visit <http://gnb.ca/firewatch>.

Nackawic's an Age-Friendly Community!

In June, the Nackawic Area was officially designated as an Age-Friendly Community by the Gov. of NB and the United Nations. In order to

receive this distinction, the community had to demonstrate that this area is one that has an inclusive and accessible environment that retains its population by promoting healthy, safe and active living.

There was a small celebration held to mark this occasion at the Axe on the waterfront and new initiatives were discussed for the ensuing months. The committee in conjunction with area organizations, will proudly work to make any and all changes needed to fulfill the mandate that goes with this designation.



Take Back The Night is the earliest worldwide movement to stand against sexual violence, especially violence against women. Events began in the 1960's in

Belgium and England with protests about women not feeling safe walking down the street alone at night. These early marches sparked hundreds of events on college campuses and in communities of all sizes and locations, all hoping to bring awareness to sexual violence and provide support for victims. Sixty years later, A Take Back The Night march will be happening in Nackawic on Friday, September 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm. Participants are asked to meet at the Nackawic High School lower parking lot and bring your signs.
