### DOG TAGS

2018 Dog Tags are available at Town Hall. The cost for dogs that have been vaccinated, spayed or neutered is \$15.00. Section 3.01 of By-law S-12 states, “No person who is a resident in the Town of Nackawic shall own a dog without having a valid license for that dog under this by-law”. Fines for not having a dog tag start at \$25.00.

**Power Outages:** In the event of a power outage in Nackawic lasting more than 4-6 hrs, please be advised that the Lions Centre is the designated place for people to go to get warmed up, have a hot drink and something to eat.

### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Please be advised that the Public Works Garage is open from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday – Friday.

**Garbage Collection** – You are reminded that ashes are not permitted for weekly garbage collection.

**Garbage Cans** – The Public Works Department is asking for your cooperation during storms on garbage day. Where a median is available, position your garbage can between the sidewalk and the street. Where there is no median, or the median is not wide enough, please position your garbage can at the corner of your yard. This will facilitate our work and expedite the clearing of the sidewalks and streets. The Public Works Department appreciates your cooperation.

**Parking Restrictions** – By-law T-1, states, “During the months of December, January, February and March, between the hours of midnight and 7:00 am, no person shall stop or park a vehicle unattended on any street in the town.” Vehicles will be towed at the owner’s expense.

**Snow Removal** – When shovelling or removing snow from your driveway or walkway, please do not leave it on the street, sidewalk, or move it to another property.
