Council meetings for the month will take place on Monday, May 7th and Tuesday May 22nd at the Town Hall. Council meetings are open to the public and are called to order at 7:00 pm. No matter shall be placed on the agenda for consideration at any regular Council meeting unless the request for consideration of the matter is received by the Chief Administrative Officer, in writing, before 12:00 noon on the Friday preceding the day on which the meeting is to be held.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS!!

The Town of Nackawic has enlisted in the Regional Service Commission 11 Water/Sewer Enforcement Services. Any resident that accumulates a year of unpaid water/sewer fees (currently \$474.60) will be automatically disconnected. This will follow the standard late payment notices that you would have already received prior to that point.

BUILDING PERMITS

Spring is here and we're all eager to renovate or start construction. All development and construction projects in Nackawic are overseen by Regional Service Commission 11 Planning and Development. DOG TAGS

2018 Dog Tags are available at Town Hall. The cost for dogs that have been vaccinated, spayed or neutered is \$15.00. Section 3.01 of By-law S-12 states, "No person who is a resident in the Town of Nackawic shall own a dog without having a valid license for that dog under this by-law". Fines for not having a dog tag start at \$25.00.

PLEASE STOOP & SCOOP

By-law S-3, A By-law relating to the Control & Licensing of Dogs, section 7.03 states, "any person having care, custody or control of a dog shall remove forthwith any excrement deposited by said dog on any property in the Town. This does not apply to the dog owner's property." Fines range from \$25.00 to \$200.00.

FIRE PERMITS

Fire Permit forms are available at Town Hall. Section 14.01 of By-law S-11, A By-law respecting the Fire Department, states, "Any person who proposes to ignite a fire within the Town limits shall make a written application to the Fire Chief for a permit." A new permit is required each time you burn and they are free.

Back yard fire pits are to be inspected by the Fire Department prior to being issued a 2017 summer fire permit. Please drop by or call the Town Hall at 575-2241 to complete a fire permit application form. Fines for not having a valid permit range from \$50 to \$200. Call the Department of Natural Resources at 1-866-458-8080 or visit www.gnb.ca to make sure there are no fire bans in the area.

NACKAWIC PUBLIC/SCHOOL LIBRARY
