The Town asked that you have your dog tagged, so that if your dog is picked up by NBSPCA they can reunite the dog with its owner quickly and easily. 2021 Dog Tags are available at Town Hall. The cost

for dogs that have been vaccinated, spayed or neutered is \$15.00. Section 3.01 of By-law S-12 states, “No person who is a resident in the Town of Nackawic shall own a dog without having a valid license for that dog under this by-law”. Fines for not having a dog tag start at \$25.00.

By-law S-3, A By-law relating to the Control & Licensing of Dogs, section 7.03 states, “any person having care, custody or control of a dog shall remove forthwith any excrement deposited by said dog on any property in the Town. This does not apply to the dog owner’s property.” Fines range from \$25.00 to \$200.00.

Fire Permit forms are available at Town Hall. Section 14.01 of By-law S-11, A By-law respecting the Fire Department, states, “Any person who proposes to ignite a fire within the Town limits shall make a written application to the Fire Chief for a permit.” A new permit is required each time you burn.

Back yard fire pits are to be inspected by the Fire Department prior to being issued a 2021 summer fire permit. Please drop by or call the Town Hall to complete a fire permit application. Fines for not having a valid permit range from \$50 to \$200.

Nackawic High School will be participating in the New Brunswick International Student Program again next year. We are

hoping to expand the program, but in order to do so, we are seeking to increase the number of participating host families for the 2021/2022 school year. Becoming a host family to a student from a different country and culture is an enriching and worthwhile experience. Welcoming international students into your home helps develop friendships that will last a lifetime. By sharing your home and offering guidance to your student, your family becomes an important part of their life. Placements can be from September to January, February to June, or for the entire school year. Visiting students live with a host family, attend regular classes at Nackawic High School and participate in extracurricular and community activities for the duration of their visit. A host family does not need to have a child who currently attends Nackawic High School. Many grandparents, single adults and empty nesters have volunteered. There is also a financial incentive of \$700/month for host families to help compensate for the extra expense of welcoming a guest for an extended period. Bikes Program at Nackawic Elementary School sponsored by the Masonic Lodge in Temperance Vale.

The Books for Bikes program promotes Literacy. Every book a student reads; they receive a ballot. This ballot will be placed in a ballot box; so, the more books they read, the better their chance of winning a bicycle and helmet.

A new bicycle is given away for each grade in this program at NES (K-5) for a total of 12 bikes in the school year. This means two bikes for each grade. The students can read books at home as well as at school. The student will print their name, title of the book, and a few words describing what the book was about on each ballot. This will also provide the students with some writing or printing skills.
