By-law S-3, A By-law relating to the Control & Licensing of Dogs, section 7.03 states, “any person having care, custody or control of a dog shall remove forthwith any excrement deposited by said dog on any property in the Town. This does not apply to the dog owner’s property.” Fines range from \$25.00 to \$200.00.

Fire Permit forms are available at Town Hall. Section 14.01 of By-law S-11, A By-law Respecting the Fire Department, states, “Any person who proposes to ignite a fire within the Town limits shall make a written application to the Fire Chief for a permit.” A new permit is required each time you burn. (This does not include backyard fire pits). Fines for not having a valid permit range from \$50 to \$200. 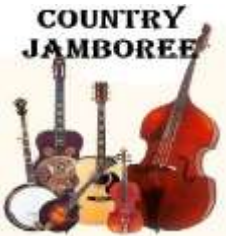
The recycle box is open now. It is for clothes only. This is an important fundraiser for the NB Diabetes Foundation.

next year. This year, we have already confirmed placements for two full-year students from Germany, and one half-year student from Turkey arriving in late January. We are hoping to expand the program even further, but in order to do so, we are seeking additional host families for these students. We are currently seeking host families for 2nd semester (late January to June) and for the 2020-2021 school year. Becoming a host family to a student from a different country and culture is an enriching and worthwhile experience. Welcoming international students into your home helps develop friendships that will last a lifetime. Visiting students live with a host family, attend regular classes at Nackawic High School and participate in extra-curricular and community activities for the duration of their visit. A host family does not need to have a child who currently attends school. Many grandparents, single adults and empty-nesters have volunteered to host students. There is also a financial incentive for host families to help compensate for the extra expense of welcoming a guest for an extended period.
