2022 Dog Tags are available at Town Hall. The cost for dogs that have been vaccinated, spayed or neutered is \$15.00. "No person who is a resident in the Town of

Nackawic shall own a dog without having a valid license for that dog under the Town's Dog By-Law". Fines for not having a dog tag start at \$25.00.

Please be advised that the Public Works Garage is open from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday – Friday. By-law T-1, states, "During the months of December, January,

February and March, between the hours of midnight and 7:00 am, no person shall stop or park a vehicle unattended on any street in the town.

Nackawic High School is currently enjoying its most successful year ever with the New Brunswick International Student Program. Over the course of the year, we will have hosted 7 students from 6 countries. While the 2022-2023 school year still seems far away, we are currently searching for host families for next year's international students. Becoming a host family to a student from a different country and culture is an enriching and worthwhile experience. Welcoming international students into your home helps develop friendships that will last a lifetime. By sharing your home and offering guidance to your student, your family becomes an important part of their life. Placements can be from September to January, February to June, or for the entire school year. Visiting students live with a host family, attend regular classes at Nackawic High School and participate in extra-curricular and community activities for the duration of their visit. A host family does not need to have a child who currently attends school. Many grandparents, single adults and empty-nesters have volunteered to host students. There is also a financial incentive of \$750/month for host families to help compensate for the extra expense of welcoming a guest for an extended period.
