Fire Permit forms are available at Town Hall. Section 14.01 of By-law S-11. Α **Bv-law Respecting the Fire Department**, states, "Any person who

proposes to ignite a fire within the Town limits shall make a written application to the Fire Chief for a permit." A new permit is required each time you burn. (This does not include backyard fire pits). Fines for not having a valid permit range from \$50 to \$200. By sharing your home and offering guidance to your student, your family becomes an important part of their life. Visiting students live with a host family, attend regular classes at Nackawic High School and participate in extra-curricular and community activities for the duration of their visit. A host family does not need to have a child who currently attends school. Many grandparents, single adults and empty-nesters have volunteered to host students. There is also a financial incentive of \$750/month for host families to help compensate for the extra expense of welcoming a guest for an extended period.
